

Notice About 2026 Tax Rates
Property Tax Rates in Uvalde County

This notice concerns the 2026 property tax rates for Uvalde County. This notice provides information about two tax rates used in adopting the current tax year’s tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would Impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Unencumbered Fund Balance

The following estimated balances will be left in the taxing unit’s accounts at the end of the fiscal year. These balances are not encumbered by corresponding debt obligation.

Current Year Debt Service

The following amounts are for long-term debts that are secured by property taxes. These amounts will be paid from upcoming property tax revenues (or additional sales tax revenues, if applicable).

Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustments

State Criminal Justice Mandate

The Uvalde County Auditor certifies that Uvalde County has spent \$815,629 in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Uvalde County Sheriff has provided Uvalde County information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for reimbursement of such costs. This increased the voter-approval tax rate by 0.003557/\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The Uvalde County spent \$449,204 from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants received by the county. In the preceding year, the county spent \$204,564 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year’s indigent defense expenditures is \$244,640. This increased the voter-approval rate by 0.000332/\$100 to recoup 5% more than the preceding year’s expenditures.

This notice contains a summary of actual no-new-revenue and voter-approval calculations as certified by Alice Chapman, Uvalde County Auditor on 08/11/2026 .
